

BioGrace Newsletter #14 – July 2015

The project BioGrace aimed at harmonising bioenergy greenhouse gas calculations (GHG) in Europe and was supported by Intelligent Energy Europe. BioGrace-I (Contract No: IEE/09/736/SI2.558249) ran from 2010 to 2012 and dealt with liquid biofuels, BioGrace-II ran from 2012 to March 2015 and dealt with electricity, heating and cooling from biomass (Contract number: IEE/11/733/SI2.616371). Since April 2015 the BioGrace-I scheme is held and maintained by the Institute for Energy and Environmental Research (IFEU), the BioGrace-II scheme is held and maintained by Netherlands Enterprise Agency (RVO).

With the end of the IEE-financed BioGrace-project, the scheme ownership of BioGrace I was transferred to IFEU that is now managing and updating the tool.
